BULBS AND WILDFLOWERS AT BROCKLANDS

Increasingly, families want to be involved in planting flowers on graves themselves and so in response to this we have put together the following wildflower bulb and plant options. All the plants come from a specialist native nursery in Northern England.

Wildflower Bulb Options

These are available in lots of 10. The prices are for 10 bulbs and any combination of these may be ordered.



English Bluebell - Hyacinthoides non-scripta£4.70Flowers in May, violet-blue, hanging, trumpet-shaped blooms with a sweetscent.Available for planting in the Autumn and 'in the green' from February-May.



Snowdrop - *Galanthus nivalis* **£3.30** Flowers in February/March; delicate nodding white heads with green centre. Available for planting in the Autumn and in January/February 'in the green'.



Wild Daffodil - Narcissus pseudonarcissus£5.80Flowers in March/April; nodding yellow flowers, smaller than garden varieties.Available for planting in the Autumn and February to April 'in the green'.



Wood Anemone- Anemone nemorosa£3.20An early spring-flowering plant in the buttercup family, with graceful, nodding
white flowers. Available as dormant rhizomes from March to May.



Wild Garlic - Allium ursinum£4.70Broad umbel of long-stalked white flowers. Grows up to 30 cm. FlowersApril-June. Available when the bulbs are in active growth in the spring.



Winter AconiteEranthis cilicica£3.40Glossy leaves and yellow chalice-shaped flowers will carpet woodland.Flowers Jan-Feb. Available when the bulbs are in active growth in the spring.

Wildflower Plant Options

Option 1 - The six wildflower species below are the most popular and most successful ones on our site. They are available in 9cm pots, in multiples of 6, or as small plugs $(a) \pm 28$ for 6 plants (or 18 plugs) / ± 50 for 12 plants (or 36 plugs) / ± 72 for 18 plants (or 54 plugs)

- **Primrose** *Primula vulgaris* The native variety which produces yellow flowers with deep yellow eye from March to May.
- **Red Campion** *Silene dioica* Flowers April onwards, with masses of small rose and pink clusters.
- **Ragged Robin** *Lychnis flos-cuculi* Flowers May-July - several dainty pink flowers with 'ragged' petals on each stem.
- **Devilsbit Scabious** *Succisa pratensis* Flowers in July with rounded heads of blue-lilac on tall stems.
- Oxeye Daisy Leucantheum vulgare Flowers May onwards - tall with white petals and big yellow centres. Also known as Dog Daisy.
- **Foxglove** *Digitalis purpurea* Flowers June-September with strong pink trumpets hanging from tall spikes.

Option 2 - Any combination of the wildflowers listed below in 9cm pots or as small plugs up to 10 plants @ \pounds 5 per plant (\pounds 1.50 / plug), 10 plants and over \pounds 4 per plant (\pounds 1.20 / plug)

- Water Avens *Geum rivale* Flowers orange/pink with purple sepals. Damp places preferred. 30 cm
- **Columbine** *Aquilegia vulgaris* Greyish leaves, flowers blue, rose pink or white resembling Grannys Bonnets. Open woodland.
- Meadow Cranesbill *Geranium pratense* A handsome plant with bright blue flowers over 2cm across, good bee plant.
- **Greater Hawkbit** *Leontodon hispidus* Dandelion like yellow flowers. Sun. 15-45 cm June onwards.
- **Purple Loosestrife** *Lythrum salicaria* Bright red-purple spikes. Damp. 60-120 cm June-August.
- Self-Heal *Prunella vulgaris* Flowers violet/purple calyx; up to 20 cm. June onwards.
- **Birdsfoot Trefoil** *Lotus corniculatus* 'Eggs and Bacon' Lovely clusters of yellow/orange pea-like flowers, May onwards.
- **Common Dog Violet** *Viola riviniana* Flowers blue violet. Shade tolerant. 5-10 cm April-June.
